If God takes the time and trouble to insure the lives of these littlest ones surely God will take care of you and me. Life goes on ... then, now, and in Christ, always. The cycle continues; the rhythm endures because God has ordained it. Thanks be to God!



Church Council Meeting March 22, 2015

Attending: Pastor Ricki, Linda Shivers, Terri Goldich, Carol Robbins, Judie and Stan Culy, Sandy Gallop, Geoff Gerow, Phyllis King, Mel Bacha, Don Ross, Bridget and David Joy

The following is a brief summary of reports presented. Individual reports on file in the office.

<u>Church Treasurer</u>: (on file) End of February we have \$999.68 balance in checking account.

<u>Trustees</u>: (on file) Recommend that the Fellowship Hall be carpeted over with a product called carpet squares; they are estimated to cost around \$9600. A bequest from the estate of Hazel Dimock Bedard was received; trustee board requested that it be used to start a fund for the new carpet in F. Hall.* Snow removal cost for December through February has totaled \$3835. Budgeted at only \$3000.Pastor Ricki has notified Trustees that she plans to vacate the parsonage by June 1st. That allows us several weeks to spruce it up prior to Rev. O'Neil moving in.

<u>Worship:</u> (on file). Lenten services – Palm Sunday- children will distribute palm crosses; Maundy Thursday evening will be reenactment of the last supper (communion), Easter Sunday will be the traditional awakening service. Children's Day/Confirmation Class Sunday on May 17. Our summer service hours will begin on Father's Day, June 21.

<u>Staff Parish Relations Committee</u>: (on file). Pastor Ricki's last preaching date will be June 14; the balance of the month will be taken as vacation time. Services on June 21 and 28 will be led by lay people/speakers. Rev. Paul O'Neil will preach on July 5th. A farewell celebration will be held on June 14 for Pastor Ricki. A welcoming event will be held for Rev. O'Neil on his first Sunday. A new Director of Christian Ed will soon be named to replace Eileen Gay whose last Day will be May 18, the closing day of church school before summer.

<u>VBS:</u> (on file). VBS runs June 29 – July 3rd with Family Night July 2nd. We are going alone this year. Mailing going out to 44 families of last year's VBS. This year's Director is Linda Shivers with Don Corne and Eileen Gay the co-directors.

<u>Council Chair:</u> (on file) "Discovering the Possibilities" study underway with open discussion with congregation and leadership on May 3, after service, led by (Rev) Rick McKinley. Lunch at 12:30 pm. Discussion on exploring existing and new ministries. Brief study of greater use of F. Hall for outside banquets and events was presented. Quarterly Town Hall meetings on church budget and spending to be hold Sunday, April 26 by Pete and George.

*voted to use the \$1000 bequest for F. Hall new carpet. Motion made by Don Ross; seconded by Terri Goldich. Passed. No abstentions.
