


Church Decorating Party - December 5th


The annual Church Decorating Party will be on Saturday, December 5th at 6:00pm. We will be hanging the greens, decorating the trees, and just enjoying the season of celebrating Jesus' birth.

If you are attending, please plan on bringing an appetizer to be shared, a re-gifted item for our Yankee Swap, and an unwrapped toy which will be for a mission project.

The Christian season of Advent is symbolic of waiting for Christ's coming into the world at Christmas. In a sense, Advent conveys a dual meaning of waiting and readiness.

Every Sunday during Advent, we will progressively light the Advent candles: three purple and one pink. The purple represents repentance and the pink symbolizes joy. On Christmas Eve, we will light the Christ Candle, which is the white candle in the center of the wreath. Every Sunday, a selected individual or family will read a scripture, recite a statement and light the candle in keeping with the season.

In additional to this, we will sing **#2090 Advent Song** in **The Faith We Sing** hymnbook. The first Sunday, we will sing the first verse. The second will be verses 1-2. The third week, verses 1-3, etc.

Nov 29: Light the Advent candle one; Now the waiting has begun; we have started on our way, time to think of Christmas day. Refrain: Candle, candle, burning bright, shining in the cold winter night; candle, candle burning bright, fill our hearts with Christmas night.

Dec 6: Light the Advent candle two. Think of humble shepherds, who filled with wonder at the sight of the child of Christmas night.

Dec 13: Light the Advent candle three. Think of heavenly harmony; angels singing "Peace on earth" at the blessed Savior's birth.

Dec 20: Light the Advent Candle, four; Think of joy forever more; Christ Child in a stable born, gift of love that Christmas morn.

Dec 24: Light the Christmas candles, now; Sing of donkey, sheep, and cow; birthday candles for the King, let the alleluia's ring.

As we light the candles of hope (week 1); peace (week 2); joy (week 3): love (week 4) and finally the Christ candle on Christmas Eve, we symbolically drive back the darkness and invite more of the light of God into our lives. If the message of the gospel does not burn anew within us, the burning of these candles will have little effect. But if we reflect upon the meaning behind the lighting of the candle, we encompass the message.

Christmas is a season of light; Christ came to bring light to the darkness. With Jesus in our hearts, our Lord has provided light for our souls. May the Lord provide us with inward hope for the season as we experience the many lights of Christmas.




