MARRI FAMILY UPDATE

Sandy Gallup made two beautiful quilts for the Marri Family. They were given to them on Wednesday November 8th.

On Saturday, November 4, Steve Yoder, Stan and Judie Culy, Nat Woodruff and two of the Culy neighbors gathered at the house of Kathryn Leenhouts to move three beautiful dressers she had donated to our Syrian refugee family. First, they were stored in the church until Wednesday, November 8, when Pastor Paul walked two of these dressers from the Fellowship Hall to the Culy van. When the van arrived in New Britain, the men carried the dressers into the house. From there, Pastor Paul once again walked the dressers to the back bedroom. Walking a dresser requires the mover to grip the sides of a dresser, lifting one side forward at a time, balancing on one leg of the dresser. To see it is to believe it. Our thanks go to Kathy for this wonderful gift and to all the men for moving these gifts to the refugee home.

Bible Devotional - Fridays at 10 am: We are showing a video on the Gospel of Matthew followed by discussion of what we watched.

Pastor's Prayer Meeting- Saturdays, 9 am to 11 am: Join Pastor Paul and a group of United Methodist from Ghana as we pray for the United States, the United Methodist Church, and our local church.

CHURCH REPORTING AND OTHER BORING TOPICS

Throughout the year I record data provided to me for compilation. Some of this data is reported to the district superintendant at our annual charge conference; other data I use when ordering supplies or printing bulletins. Still more data is updated so we can see a tangible record of the good we have done throughout the year. However a lack of information skews our results. Please take a minute to review below some of the items I need for accurate reporting.

Birthdates: Month, Day and Year. The district asks for reporting on the age ranges of our members. For many people, I do not have a year they were born and, therefore, don't have their age to report properly.

Classroom Attendance: I record the class attendance in Servant Keeper; to do this I need a first and last name. I enter the attendance by person, not a total number. First name, Last name, birth date, and grade (for kids) are the minimum I need to enter the attendance properly. Ideally we would also receive address, phone, and email from new people. Please let me know which people are together as members of the same family; these relationships are especially difficult to guess when there are multiple last names in a family.

Worship Attendance: I record our worship attendance by total number, not individual names. The head usher for the service should please count or assign someone to count the number of people in attendance and leave me a note on my desk.

Food Collection: We record the weekly collection of the food items donated. Please leave the quantity of items donated in a note on my desk.

Event Results: Please remember to include me when you have totaled the amount collected at your fundraising events.

Upcoming Events: There are many places I can advertise--newspaper, radio, social media, web calendars, etc. Please send me the details about your upcoming events so I can advertise them. The earlier we get the word out, the more press we will receive. Please let me help you.

I am going to review servant keeper for some of the data I am missing and send notes to the relevant people. Please help me update our records.

DECEMBER IS NATIONAL SAFE TOYS AND GIFTS MONTH

The Consumer Product Safety Commission (https://www.cpsc.gov/) reports 28 toy recalls in 2017. They provide these tips for safe gift buying:

- Check the label: Choose age appropriate toys by reading the age label on the toy. Children younger than 3 should not have access to toys with small parts, which can cause choking. Also avoid marbles and small balls for children under 3.
- Get safety gear. With scooters and other riding toys, supervision is key along with proper safety gear that includes helmets. Helmets should be worn properly at all times and they should be sized to fit. Avoid riding a scooter on a street or roadway with other motor vehicles.
- Hoverboards: Although not considered a toy, hoverboards should be compliant with UL 2272 safety standard.
- Be careful with magnets: High powered magnet sets are dangerous and should be kept away from children under 14. Building and play sets with small magnets should also be kept away from small children.

W.A.T.C.H. (World Against Toys Causing Harm, Inc) puts out a yearly "10 Worst Toys" list; it can be found on their website https://toysafety.org/.

Here are some General Toy Safety Tips from https://www.playsafe.org, a safety organization formed by the trade association of toy designers, producers, and licensing, The Toy Association.

No matter how old they are or where they're playing, we know your little one's safety is your top concern. Here are a few things to keep in mind to help make sure playtime for kids of all ages is fun and safe.

- Parents or adults should always supervise play, especially for younger children.
- Dispose of all unnecessary toy packaging and gift-wrap as soon as possible (piles of discarded gift-wrap can conceal sharp objects and the edges of hard plastic packaging that can cut small fingers).
- Read instructions carefully. Save directions, warranties and assembly hardware.
- Get on the floor and play with your kids! Demonstrating the correct way to use a toy or game is the best way to make sure your child understands how to properly and safely enjoy it.
- At parties and other festive events, be sure to supervise children around latex balloons. Un-inflated balloons and broken pieces can pose a choking hazard.
- Store toys safely in an easily accessible storage bin. Lidded toy storage should be non-locking and have special safety features like air holes, spring-loaded hinges and clearances at the hinges to make sure little fingers won't get caught.
- Organize and store toys to prevent slips, trips and falls.
- Keep a separate toy chest for older kids whose toys may contain small parts. Enlist their help in keeping their toys out of the hands of younger siblings.
- Regularly sort through the toy box to discard broken toys.
- Speak to grandparents and other caregivers about the importance of choosing appropriate toys and supervising play!


