- 1. Identity: Acceptance and appreciation for the Methodist Tradition of the bishop sending the clergy to the local church.
- 2. Trust: Believing that through God's guidance, the bishop will send us the best available clergy; someone who will address the specific needs of our church.
- 3. Grace: The local church will address their grief at saying goodbye to the departing pastor and welcome the new pastor warmly and completely before getting to know him/her.
- 4. Respect: Acceptance and eagerness for the new pastor's style and messages. "There is an anticipation of how this unique person will move the church forward in its mission and ministry."
- 5. Belonging: In the beginning there will be a time of adjustment and formation; soon both pastor and congregation will feel they belong with each other.
- 6. Accomplishment: With renewed energy the pastor and congregation work to "move the ministry of the church forward".
- 7. Change: The cycle will begin again. Take the time to grieve together and prepare for what is ahead.


