For over 35 years we have been participating in the Good Friday Walk. It is a multi-organizational effort to raise money for both national and local charities. 

JESUS WALKED ON GOOD FRIDAY, WILL YOU?

Dear Church Family,

We are well into the 40 day Lenten season which is traditionally a time for soul searching and spiritual reflection. On February 10, our church participated in a joint Ash Wednesday service at the Crystal Lake United Methodist Church.



On **Thursday, March 24 at 7 PM,** we have been invited by the Trinity United Methodist Church in Windsor to join them in their **Maundy Thursday worship service**. A group called Jews for Jesus will be present to explain the link between the ancient Festival of Redemption and Christ as the Lamb of God. We will actually see a table set with traditional Passover items and hear the story of the Exodus told with comparisons with the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. We will conclude this presentation by the celebration of communion.

On **Friday, March 25 at 7:30 AM**, our church will host for the 32nd consecutive year the **Good Friday Walk**. This concept was introduced in the early 1980's by Pastor Richard Thompson. Historically our church raises \$12,000 which supports Sharing, Inc., a non-profit organization that raises money to provide food, clothes, and books to the under-privileged people in the southern states. One third of the proceeds will go to support the Tri-Town Shelter, a local fifteen bed emergency shelter for homeless individuals.

The highlight of the Christian year is our **Easter Sunday Worship Service** on **March 27 at 10 AM**. Easter is the belief that that Jesus rose from the dead. The four gospels (Matthew 28; Mark 16; Luke 24 and John 20 &21 all contain abundant testimony to the resurrection of Jesus. As our church family prepares to celebrate Easter, let us renew our commitment to love and serve the Lord.

The Lord is Risen. He is Risen Indeed.

Small Groups (Phyllis King)

The Seekers report: The group has postponed during February due to travel and health concerns.

The Greeters report: Phyllis will not be recruiting for new members and hopes someone else will take over that role. She will continue to greet and welcome new church attendees.

Pastor's report (Pastor Paul O'Neil)

The Sunday school requested a change in the timing of communion to the time of the children's message. The group approved the change.

The Pastor and some other members visited Catholic Charities to ask how RUMC can help with incoming refugees. Pastor Paul will ask a representative to come speak to our congregation after Easter.

RUMC has been invited to participate in a Maundy Thursday Seder service in Windsor. He will put a note in the bulletin.

Christian Education (Linda Shivers)

Sunday School: Attendance has fluctuated some but we still average about 21 children a week. We are staying with the "Deep Blue" curriculum from Cokesbury. On Feb 28 we will be making pretzels for pretzel Sunday. March 27 – Easter Sunday – we would like to have the Easter egg hunt in Fellowship Hall after church if weather doesn't allow it for outside. Last year it was in the classrooms and the congregation including parents really couldn't witness the fun because of how small the area is.

I asked Pastor Paul to look into moving Communion to right after children's message- so the children and congregation are not interrupted in the middle of a lesson or worship by children coming in to find parents.

Vacation Bible School: will be the week of June 20-24. Family Night will be Thursday the 23rd. We will have to let N/A know. Last year they were very understandable and were happy of the 2 month advance notice we gave them. An email went out to all of last year's volunteers asking if they were interested in signing up again. So far I have 10 signed up. I will be writing up the registration form this upcoming week and it will be available by Feb 28th. I would like to get VBS advertised noting registration forms are available- who is in charge of contacting newspaper.

Children's Music (bells and choir): I am very happy to report that children's music is doing really well at RUMC. Children's Music Schedule: Feb 28- 9:00 am, Children's bells; Mar 6- 9:00 am Children's Choir; Mar 13- 9:00 am, Children's choir; Mar 20- 9:00 am, Children's bells; March 27- Easter- Children's bells will be playing during the worship service; April 3-9:00 am Children's Choir; April 10-9:00 am; Children's Choir.

Youth Updates: Basketball has been very popular. We are ranging around 20-22 youth with 8-12 from RUMC. We provide snacks and beverages and Wapping Church supplies the court, it is an arrangement that I have had with them for over 13 years. Next basketball dates are Feb 27, March 12 and March 26.

Grove Street Music Program has 11-12 youth interested in participating. This program is the "brainchild" of Geoff Gerow and Karen Stearns, who are also leading it. I will be attending rehearsals and doing whatever needed to make this a success. Rehearsals will be 2/28, 3/13, 4/10, 4/24, 5/8, 5/22, 6/5, 6/12 after church and then 6/18 is our concert.

Youth Sleepover: Our first get together will be a sleepover Feb 26 at 7:00 pm- 9:00 am on the 27th. I have opened this activity to 4th grade and up (friends are also invited). I feel this activity allows for all ages, 10 yrs and up, having a good time together and will establish a good base for future endeavors. We will be doing a mission project for "Kids Safe, watching and discussing a movie, games, pizza, and other snacks. We will be providing breakfast items, drinks and the pizza. Youth will bring in a snack to share. I am hoping this is the stepping stone to more youth gatherings.

Lay Leader (Candy Sunderland, Mel Bacha)

Candy Sunderland: if anyone is interested in being a liturgist, please let her know. She would like to devise a rotating schedule so there are no surprises. Candy retains the position of arranging for liturgists at this point.

Trustees (Norine Veal) (report attached)

Finance/Treasurer report (Geoff Gerow) (reports attached)

Church council members individually and collectively committed to the RUMC 10! goal for 2016. The RUMC 10! goal is to engage 10 new families or individuals into active Christian stewardship within RUMC. The group felt that two critical areas of investment needed in order to achieve this goal were Sunday School (Youth services) and Music (in particular Grove Street Music). A lengthy discussion ensued on how to accomplish this, mostly about adding support to the line item to fund the Director of Christian Education through the year as well as funding summer programs. \$5,000 was added to the Director of Christian Education to fully fund the year including summer youth services (e.g. summer Sunday school and vacation bible school). Pastor Paul graciously donated money from his funeral fund and other members rallied to refocus their church council budgets toward this cause (Sandy Gallup will move \$350 from Conference lay member budget line; SPRC will move \$100). \$1,000 was also identified as an anticipated revenue item from the gift card program for 2016. A fundraiser during Q2 will be necessary to fund \$2,000 of this \$5,000 additional expense. Karen Stearns will check for memorial money to fund the Grove Street project further. Carol Robbins made a motion to approve the budget with changes to come, with Karen Stearns seconding. Motion was carried.

Lay Leadership (Pastor Paul O'Neil)

Pastor Paul will ask Diane to create a ministry board, to track liturgists, ushers, coffee hour, greeters, flowers, etc.

Worship (Carol Robbins) (report attached)

Music (Karen Stearns)

The Grove Street Music project will be purchasing instruments for the new praise band. New music is also needed for the senior choir.




Last month, we delivered a total of **94** items to the Hockanum Valley Community Council Food Pantry. Thank you for donating to help those in need.


