We will receive \$.20 per pound for soft goods which include but not limited to the following: Clothing, shoes, hats, scarves, jewelry, accessories, bags, wallets, bedding, towels, curtains, tablecloths and other cloth materials.

The **Do Not Accept List** includes all weapons, hazardous materials, construction materials, flammable products, automobile parts, damaged furniture, beds, bedding parts, televisions, computer monitors, infant car seats, cribs and other infant products restricted by law, swing sets, food, pets, large appliances, marine vessels, swimming pools, vehicles, cash and intangible property.






