Dinner prices: adults \$13; Children 12 & under \$5 A free-will offering will be accepted at the concert.




There is no need for you to lose any sleep. Rest my child. If you need to contact me, I am only a prayer away.

RUMC has embarked on a wonderful project for the benefit and enjoyment of everyone in our church. Through memorial funds and donations we have been able to build a memorial garden in the area beyond the back parking lot. The walkway is in place and we are now ready to start some plantings and add engraved bricks to the walk.

<u>Plantings Campaign 2015</u>: There is a planting chart in the Narthex. If you wish to purchase one of the plants, consult the chart and fill out a Plantings Campaign 2015 form. The plantings dedications will be part of a special insert in the bulletin in the spring.

<u>Engraved Brick Campaign 2015</u>: Engraved bricks can be purchased for \$40 each. The bricks are 4 by 8 inches. You dedication can have up to three lines of text with 16 characters per line; a character is a letter, number, symbol or space. Engraving lines will be centered when printed. You dedication can be in honor or memory of someone, just someone's name; it can commemorate a special date or special event. All engraving requests will be verified and signed off by the requestor to prevent any issues with misspellings, etc.

Minutes from Church Council Meeting September 20, 2015

<u>Attendees</u>: Pastor Paul, Phyllis King, George Klingman, Janice Klingman, Janet O'Neil, Linda Shivers, Candy Sunderland, Sue Lessoff, Don Ross, Geoff Gerow, Bridget Joy, Mel Bacha, Sandy Gallup, Karen Stearns, Joy Pikor and Brenda Mlodzinski.

Meeting began at 11:34 pm. Paul led devotions.

<u>PASTOR</u> (Paul O'Neil)- Charge Conference was scheduled for October 8th, but we have requested another date. Paul is working on staffing volunteer positions. Paul is performing a wedding on October 11th so Stan Culy will preach.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION (Linda Shivers)- Vacation Bible School was a success with 44 children. We did not partner with any other churches this year. Expense report was finalized and we stayed in budget. We should put aside \$400 in budget for VBS 2016. Summer Sunday School was successful with an average of 14 children. Next summer a signup sheet will be passed around for adults to teach one Sunday. We should also put money in the budget for Summer Sunday School. There was a teachers meeting on August 30th. There are 4 classes: PreK to K, 1st-3rd, 4th-5th, and 6th-12th. There are not teachers for the 1st-3rd grade class. Using a new curriculum called Deep Blue by Cokesbury. Older class is using LinkedIn. Rally Day went well on Sept. 13th. Christian Ed Board was of great help in setting up. Sept. 13th was the first day of Sunday school. There was a total of 31 kids. Children will collect offering in their classrooms, they will decide where the money goes. Janet would like to start a Children's Choir, Karen and Linda will be supporting her. Linda will approach Norine Veal and Jenna Sunderland about a Children's Bell Choir. Linda would like to start a Youth Fellowship program, but not enough time right now. Perhaps after the holidays.

WORSHIP (Carol Robbins)- given by Sue. Worship met on August 20th. Paul expressed gratitude at attending the services on June 14th—July 5th. Music subs was money well spent. Fellowship Hall services, were liked because of informality. Will continue this next summer. Shepherd's Crook presentation to Paul (Ricki's gift) to be done Rally Sunday. Change in worship time has been discussed. Survey will go out to the congregation. New time will begin on Rally Day. Decision will be made at Council Meeting on Aug. 30th. Recording the services-Don will talk to Mat Mlodzinski. Nursery-who is in charge of this? Adult Ed has unofficially taken over cleaning and maintenance of it. Acolytes-Carol will check with Sherry if she is taking care of this again. Paul wants to now if we can increase tempo of service. Prayer time-Paul would like to bring up people who are comfortable for a special blessing. Communion-Intinction was confusing. Should have two chalices and one bread, people go left or right. Stewardship campaign-work on the concept of giving on a regular basis. Have people speak about their witness to giving. Upcoming Special Services-Rally Day (9/13), Laity Sunday (in October), All Saints Day (11/1). For All Saints Day use candles, pictures of people, mementos for people who died in the last year. Christmas Eve Services-Paul brought up changing times of services; suggested 4 pm for families. Future meetings will probably be quarterly. Next meeting will be 10/15. Ginny Hickton makes mini prayer shawls for newcomers, Phyllis would like to continue this direction.

<u>SPRC</u> (**Terri Goldich**)- *given by Sue*. SPRC participated in the transition between the retirement of Pastor Aiello and the arrival of Pastor O'Neil. Small group meetings with the congregation members are in the planning stages, they will be held at the parsonage. SPRC is reviewing all job descriptions for paid staff and the evaluation forms in preparation for annual evaluations. Recommendations for salary adjustments will be made to the finance committee.

<u>LAY LEADERS</u> (Mel Bacha & Candy Sunderland)- getting to know Pastor Paul and finding it challenging to get liturgists.

LAY LEADSHIP (**Pastor Paul**)- Don Ross is stepping down as Trustees Chair at the end of the year. A replacement will need to be found.

<u>PUBLICITY</u> (Janice Klingman)- Current events poster in Narthex. It will be amended to add December. Leap of faith Concert and Harvest Supper-November 7th. Letters to churches, posters and banner at our church. Diane will handle newspapers, Patch etc. Holiday Bazaar-November 21st-similar publicity. Church School activities can be advertised as well. Pastor O'Neil would like to revamp the church brochure. Anyone wishing to advertise an event can contact Janice or Diane. Diane has been working on a welcome gift-prayer shawl, bookmarks, mug, tea bags etc.

FINANCE (**Geoff Gerow**)- Budget is on target, pledges are a little off. Actual income is about \$5000 off from budget. Stewardship is coming up, opening on Oct. 18th. Oct. 25th– Kan Jam 2015. Nov. 1st—A Moment on Missions. Nov. 7th– Harvest Supper and Leap of Faith Concert. Nov. 8th—Consecration Sunday. Giving using RUMC Text Giving-after creating an account, you can make a donation or series of donations using debit or credit card. Janet will oversee a program called UnitedScrips which is a fundraiser. You purchase gift cards through the church and the church receives a % back depending on the gift card. It was very successful at their other church.

TRUSTEES (Don Ross)- the Trustees met Sept. 11. The Meditation Garden had 8 Arborvitae trees planted as well as a red maple. The maple tree was donated by Norine Veal in memory of Bob Bernier. The garden beds and mulch have been installed. The committee is launching a drive to have people sponsor more bricks for fall planting of rhododendron bushes. The parsonage was cleaned from top to bottom in preparation for Pastor Paul and Janet's arrival. Half of the anchor fence in the backyard was taken down. Pastor Paul has cleaned up the brush and unsightly shrubs in the yard. 19 people helped prepare the parsonage for transition. A contract for the school year of 2015/2016 has been signed with Vernon Adult Ed. The Trustees, Steven Phelps (new Director of Vernon Adult Ed), and Svetlana Grishtaev signed the contract at the end of August. They have rented 4 rooms for the year for a total of \$7200. The contract was modified to allow for change in the number of rooms at any time. The church heating system had two leaking pipes n the kitchen which were repaired by Nutmeg Plumbing this past week. Pastor Paul has been cleaning up brush and trees on the church property to improve the view from the Meditation Garden. The Trustees discussed launching a fund drive to replace the Fellowship Hall carpet for approximately \$10,000. Pastor Paul has asked we delay it until after the Stewardship Campaign. The next Trustees meeting will be on October 2nd.

VISITATION & NURTURE (Phyllis King)- there will not be a Jesusfest this year.

MEN'S CLUB (Don Ross)- preparing for the Christmas Roast Beef Supper in December.

SMALL GROUP (Phyllis King)- the Seekers (5 members) Ray Clark has been a good leader.

FAMILY GROUP (Karen Stearns & Geoff Gerow)- plan Family Fun Nights. The next one is October 30th-theme has not been determined. They may take over the Bell Concert date in December.

Next council meeting will be Oct. 18th.


