



#### Holiday Bazaar Craft Projects

Are you creative? Here is a knitting project for an item we can sell at our Holiday Bazaar.

Winter Headband Size 7 needle; worsted weight yarn

Cast on 70 stitches. Then join starting with a Pearl row followed by a knit row. Alternate pearl and knit rows until there are 12 to 14 ridges (depending on how wide you want it).

End with a knit row. Cast off in a pearl stitch.
