### MARRI FAMILY UPDATE

**The bad news:** Early in the summer, three year old Wiaam fell out of bed at 5 am one morning and dislocated her elbow. Aamina, the ten year old, crashed on her bike in the back yard and had to have stitches in her leg. Because there was no dental care in the refugee camp for five years, Suhaib, the six year old, had four very bad teeth pulled. The refrigerator stopped working properly and it took two weeks for the landlord to get it replaced and some of their food spoiled.

**The good news:** The good news is that Michelle Gerow and her kids have had a good time in several outings with the Marri kids. Michelle also helped arrange for two teachers from the kids' school to tutor the kids for four hours a week during the summer. With only four months of school since they arrived, we felt the help from these teachers would give a good boost before they started school again. It was exciting to see how much teaching was done each day and the fun they all had, as the teachers began to fall in love with the kids. As word of mouth spreads, additional help from other churches and friends is supplementing the ongoing help our church has given with rides and supplies.

Most of the payment for the teachers, at the going rate of \$32.50 an hour was donated by Amy Raccogni from the Trinity Lutheran Church in Vernon and the rest by our own people. Most of the month of June was Ramadan which is a religious time in Islam where adults fast from sunrise to sunset and then they feast at 8:00pm. It is also the custom to get new clothes, like we do at Easter or the start of school. We collected \$400 from our congregation to provide for this gift.

Although Mohamed, the father, and Aisha, the mother, took English as a Second Language (ESL) in the spring, they also needed some summer practice in speaking English. Tutoring was provided by four volunteers from the Emmanuel Congregational Church in Hartford. The church had just finished sponsoring a refugee family who are pretty self-sufficient now and wanted to help us. They too, came two hours a day for two days a week during the summer to help. Throw a pebble in a pool and see the ripples fan out. They are still spreading!! Many volunteers have joined our church in helping the Marri Family as the need for assistance continues.

As one of the Congregationalist's volunteers said, "They are truly a gift to us to be with. They bring their joy and gratitude for being here. They share their sense of humor and their genuine hospitality with us. I sometimes wonder how I would get along living in a new country without knowing the language or the culture. I am truly grateful for being with this family as much as I have."

The kids missed their school and friends this summer but the tutoring will give them a good start since four of the kids were promoted to the next grade, even though they had only four months of public school. Only Suhaib, the six year old, will repeat his grade. Mahmoud received a certificate for the most improved student in his 5th grade class and will be going to middle school. Steve said, "Ahid, the second grader, surprised [him] by speaking perfect English while showing [him] a picture of her class and telling [him] her teacher's name. Hard to believe how far they have come since their arrival in December."

### **September is Hunger Action Month**

Many of our neighbors do not have enough food to feed their families. Here are some things we can do during Hunger Action Month.

- Decorate a box or jar for Hunger Action Month.
- Put 50 cents in your Hunger Action Month box/jar every time you go to the grocery store this month.
- Put your loose change in your Hunger Action Month box/jar at the end the day once-a-week this month.
- When saying grace, ask God to bless someone who is hungry as well as your meal.
- Use your "when you buy 3" coupons for groceries you need; donate one of the items to the local food pantry. (The collection box for the local food pantries is in the church narthex.)
- Reduce perishable food waste: "buy no more than what you expect to use; you will be more likely to keep it fresh and use it all."




