The past 5 years that I have been at RUMC, I have been resting from a non-stop 24 year choir schedule, I have always believed that He would lead me back into my music ministry with children and, as I said, I have felt called now. I believe that Children's Choir is NOT only about the music, but the Children's Choir is also a "small group" study for children. It is about:

- 1. The words that are buried into the hearts of children, words that assure them that Jesus loves each one of them fastened there with melody.
- 2. Learning to care about each other, supporting each other with attendance, listening to the other person sing and praying for each other and their families.
- 3. Leading the Church family in worship by singing in the service, singing praise and prayers, love and lessons.
- 4. Enjoying music and making music.

There are many details yet to be decided, and some of them will depend on who is singing and how many are singing. Please keep this developing program in your prayers.
